#### **“An Education”**

The next showing at the Liphook Millennium Centre Cinema will be “An Education” on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> May.

It’s 1961 and attractive, bright Jenny (Carey Mulligan) is poised on the brink of womanhood, dreaming of a rarefied Gauloise-scented existence as she sings along to Juliette Greco in her Twickenham bedroom. Stifled by the tedium of adolescent routine, Jenny can’t wait for adult life to begin. Meanwhile, she’s a diligent student, excelling in every subject except the Latin that her father is convinced will land her the place she dreams of at Oxford University.

On the cusp of her 17th birthday Jenny finds herself in a whirlwind romance with the much older David (Peter Sarsgaard). When she sees the lifestyle David can provide, one she never imagined could be hers, she is hooked and thoughts of Oxford are forgotten. Then, when things are looking pretty good for Jenny with the dashing (yet a little too smooth) David, the truth hits her like a ton of bricks. Jenny goes from being a bright eyed school girl and a sophisticated young lady, all the way back to questioning if she really knows who she is at all. 'An Education' won the Audience Choice award and the Cinematography award at the 2009 Sundance Film Festival.

Doors open at 7.30 p.m. and the performance starts at 8 p.m. Tickets are priced at £5, with a concession of £4 for OAPs (60 and over) and young people under 15 years of age. The film is classified as a 12A – suitable for 12 years and over. No-one younger than 12 may see a ‘12A’ film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult and films classified ‘12A’ are not recommended for a child below 12. Films classified as 12A may upset children under 12 or contain material which many parents would find unsuitable for them.

The Cinema Licence for the Liphook Millennium Centre requires that children under the age of 15 can only be admitted if accompanied by an adult.
