#### “From Time to Time”

The next showing at the Liphook Millennium Centre Cinema will be “From Time to Time” on Friday 7 January 2011.

Based on Lucy M Boston’s best selling novel ‘The Children of Green Knowe’ and directed by Oscar Winner & Writer of Gosford Park and Downton Abbey Julian Fellowes. Starring the inimitable Maggie Smith and Hugh Bonneville (both of Downton Abbey), Timothy Spall (Secrets & Lies) and Dominic West (The Wire) it is an engrossing family ghost story that will delight both adults and children alike.

In times of war two centuries apart, two distinct worlds are linked by a single family and the house in which they live. It is 1944 and 13-year-old Tolly Oldknow (Alex Etel) is sent to spend Christmas with this grandmother (Maggie Smith), while his mother searches for news of his father in wartime London. Spending his days exploring the sprawling ancestral estate, he begins to uncover family secrets and ghosts from the past as he becomes witness to events during the Napoleonic wars and finds himself slowly drawn into participating in the drama. Invisible to most people in the past, yet able to move amongst them, he begins to unravel the mystery which has bewildered his family for two centuries. The solution to the puzzle leads him into his greatest adventure yet. A wonderful heart-warming story of a young boy learning the value of his family and its history.

"I've wanted to make this film since I was a child because I have been in love with the Green Knowe books from when I was first given them by an aunt at a very young age," explains writer/director/producer Julian Fellowes on the enduring charm of these books. "I love this film. I love every one of the performances given by the really wonderful cast I have somehow been allowed to assemble." And it really is a wonderful cast, including Hugh Bonneville, Timothy Spall, Carice van Houten and Harriet Walter. For Julian, who is a resident of Dorset, relocating the story from Cambridgeshire to the West Country "brought two major blessings to the shoot, the first was to be able to invest the film with the beauty and mystery that this area of England seems to have in such abundance, the second was to sleep in my own bed."

Doors open at 7.30 p.m. and the film starts at 8 p.m. Tickets are priced at £5, with a concession of £4 for OAPs (60 and over).
