“The Social Network”

The next showing at the Liphook Millennium Centre Cinema will be “The Social Network ” on Friday 6th May.

“The Social Network” is a 2010 drama film about the founding of the social networking website Facebook and the resulting lawsuits. On a night in October 2003, Harvard undergraduate and computer programming genius Mark Zuckerberg (Jesse Eisenberg) sits down at his computer and heatedly begins working on a new idea. In a fury of blogging and programming, what begins in his dorm room soon becomes a global social network and a revolution in communication. Zuckerberg gets investment from fellow geek Eduardo Saverin (Andrew Garfield), of whose marginally superior social success he is jealous and whom he later betrays by cutting him out of the action in favour of web entrepreneur Sean Parker (Justin Timberlake). Wealthy alpha-male twin brothers Cameron and Tyler Winklevoss (both played by Armie Hammer) plan to launch their own site, called The Harvard Connection, and try to recruit Mark as their tame techie-nerd; initially dazzled by their cachet, Zuckerberg plays them along, fatally delaying their launch while secretly getting his own up and running.

The film was directed by David Fincher and has been described as “Impeccably scripted, beautifully directed, and filled with fine performances, The Social Network is a riveting, ambitious example of modern filmmaking at its finest”.

Doors open at 7.30 p.m. and the performance starts at 8 p.m. Tickets are priced at £5, with a concession of £4 for OAPs (60 and over) and young people under 15 years of age. The film is classified as a 12A – and may be unsuitable for under 12s. Those aged under 12 are only admitted if accompanied by an adult at all times during the performance.
