**EH853 - B3004 Headley Road / Hill House Road, Liphook - Carriageway
Resurfacing - Night Working Advance Notification**

As part of Operation Resilience, Hampshire County Council's programme to make Hampshire's roads more resilient to the effects of extreme weather and heavy traffic, we will be undertaking preparatory and carriageway resurfacing on B3004 Headley Road and Hill House Road, Liphook, between Fieldcot and Lowsley House.

The works are currently programmed as follows:

- **Preparatory Works** (Day-time working) – starting Monday 12th September 2022 and are expected to take 2 days to complete – works will be carried out under temporary traffic lights from 09:30 to 16:00hrs each day
- **Carriageway Resurfacing** (Night-time working) – starting Wednesday 28th September 2022 and are expected to take 4 nights to complete. To undertake the works safely **the road will be closed** from 19:00 to 07:00hrs each night. The road will be outside of these hours and over the weekend. each day
- **Carriageway Edge/Verge Resistatement Works** (Day-time working) – starting Tuesday 4th October 2022 and are expected to take 1 day to complete – works will be carried out under temporary traffic lights from 09:30 to 16:00hrs

As a resident, you are receiving this letter to inform you that, due to the close proximity of your property to the works, you are within an area which may experience some noise disturbance overnight. We are aware of the issues created by night working and will endeavour to keep noise levels reduced whenever possible.

Whilst there is an allowance within the time period shown overleaf for delays, there may be times when we have to postpone works at very short notice; based on the latest weather forecasts, this can occur just prior to works commencing. We will always look to provide up to date information wherever we can, but sometimes these last minute decisions can be difficult to relay to the travelling public in a timely manner. **When we can, any significant changes to the scheduled dates will be made clear on the yellow sign boards located at the works limits.**

In order to help us to complete the work as quickly as possible, please ensure that no vehicles are parked on the road in the vicinity of the works while they are in progress. **Please be aware any vehicles left parked on the road that prevent the works taking place, face the risk of being removed.**

For your safety and that of our workforce, if you are located within the extents of the road closure we are unable to guarantee vehicular access to and from your property during working hours. Should you need to make an essential journey, please contact a member of the workforce in advance and they will be able to advise if they can accommodate your request. Pedestrian access will be available at all times.

The surfacing operation uses a separate bitumen layer in addition to the new asphalt carriageway surface. In order to avoid potential injury or damage, please do not walk across the carriageway during the works unless directed by a member of the workforce.


