
### The Money

## Each year, Hampshire County Council....

- Supports around 10,000 children in need of social care
- Provides 360,000 meals on wheels lunches
- Educates 138,000 pupils in 463 maintained schools
- Maintains 5,500 miles of road and 1,750 bridges and structures
- Provides long term care to 18,400 adults, 2/3 of whom are older people
- Manages 3,600 hectares of land, for wildlife, heritage and public use
- Prevents over £1m of unregulated, unsafe goods through Trading Standards
- Manages over 600,000 tonnes of household waste and recycling
- Supports 3,000 victims of domestic abuse



SP25 Savings consultation






The County Council has a legal responsibility to carry out certain functions. We cannot say 'no' if someone asks for support and in many cases we cannot means test or ask for a contribution toward the cost of providing a service.

Our projections show that while we will be able to balance our budget for the next two years, by 2026 there will be an anticipated shortfall of £132 million. SP25 therefore looks to find ways to bridge that gap should support from Government not be forthcoming.

We know Hampshire's residents were supportive of service change, but notably opposed to service reduction.

#### SP25 Timeline:






## Roads: every day in Hampshire:

22,500,000 car miles are driven




96% of everyday journeys in Hampshire are made on roads, cycleways and footways (4% of residents in Hampshire travel by train)




### **Potholes**


#### **How potholes form**

- 1 Rainwater seeps into cracks caused by heavy traffic. Low temperatures make the water freeze, expanding and deepening the cracks, and creating more fissures. The water also seeps into the rock, gravel and sand that make up the roadbed, softening it.
- 2 Passing vehicles create more cracks.
  Rain and melted snow continue to seep into the cracks.
  When it freezes and expands, the subsurface water lifts and weakens the road; when it melts and contracts, it leaves a cavity.





3 The roadbed continues to soften and erode, weakening the base support. Small chunks of the road break off, and more small cracks appear. Eventually, with the continued passage of vehicles, the surface breaks apart and is pushed down into the soft roadbed. The pothole is





### Temporary fill vs permanent repair



- We make safe with a temporary infill and come back to repair permanently later.
- 7:1 Ratio in terms of time
- 10:1 Ratio in terms of cost
